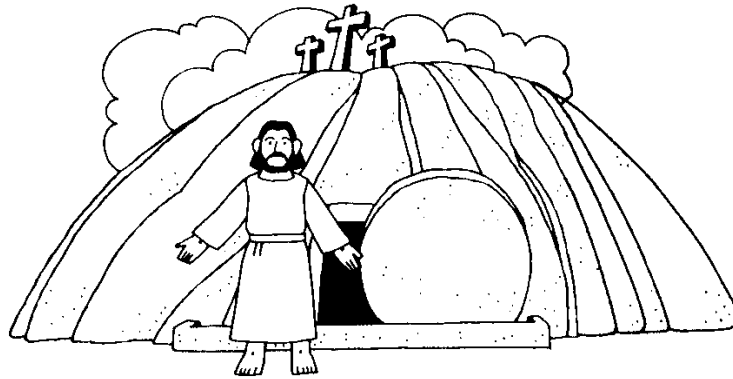

Resurrection

"Jesus has risen!" shouted Jesus' followers when they discovered the empty tomb. Jesus is the fulfillment of the prophet's dream of long ago: of the coming of a Messiah. They, and we, find hope for ourselves because Jesus, God with us, is at work in the world teaching us to be more kind.

Our memory verse is Romans 10:9

If you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. (NRSV)
