James McGinnis (retired Presbyterian minister living in Cary), Dick Griffin of Cary, and Dot Bass (PUCR Representative) appointed on November 15, 1977
- 9. First Devotional Service and Business Meeting: On December 4, 1977, at MacGregor Downs Youth Center
- 10.First Presbytery Task Force Meeting: On January 6, 1978, Orange Presbytery's Division of Education and Missions resolved to proceed officially toward establishing the church and appointed the Task Force consisting of Leon Gabriel, Fred Manley, Louise Crawford, Ernest Myatt Pastor Neil Bain, PUCR Representative Dot Bass, UNC-CH Campus Minister Milton Carothers, West Raleigh Member Dot Temple, and Rev. Doug Vaughn as chair (St. Giles and Pastor of the Manleys).

- **14.Meeting to Select Church Name:** August 1979. The Kirk of Kildaire, Presbyterian - the chosen name - was suggested by Janet Holcombe.
- 15.Service of Organization: Reformation Sunday, October 28, 1979, at 7:00 p.m. at Kildaire Farms Visitors Center. It consisted of three parts: (1) the Worship Service led by Rev. Dr. Bill McCorkle, (2) the Organization Service led by Rev. Herb Underwood in which 92 charter members were received, and (3) the Congregation Meeting led by Rev. Dr. Gene Witherspoon that consisted of confirming the election of the ruling elders and the selection of the church name.
- **16.First 92 (Charter) Members:** 15 charter members were received by profession and reaffirmation of faith. They were: Jocelyn Carter, Duane Dawes, Susan Day, Claire Dixon, Lisa Fries, Andy Greene, Laura Manley, Robin Montgomery, Tom Montgomery, Carl Osman, Carol Osman, Joe Osman, Louis Parker, Robert Phillips, and Julia Sanderford. The Sacrament of Baptism was administered to Andy Greene and to Joe Osman.

(The first communicants class consisted of Andy Greene, Laura Manley, Lisa Fries, Susan Day, Jocelyn Carter, and Duane Dawes. They were led by Pastor Gene Witherspoon and were examined and approved by the Provisional Session on October 21 and 22, 1979.)

77 charter members were received by transfer of church letter.
